



# Types of FORTIFIED Home™ Re-designations

Type of Re-designation	Definition	Expires	Examples
<b>On-Time</b>	Designations renewed one year before to one year after the expiration date.  <b>Standard re-designation submittal fees apply.</b>	Five years from prior certificate's expiration date	The Smith's designation expired on June 1, 2023.  Their re-designation evaluation was approved on September 15, 2023, and expires on June 1, 2028.
<b>Late</b>	Designations renewed more than one year and less than five years after the expiration date.  <b>Standard re-designation submittal fees plus a \$50 Late Re-designation fee apply.</b>	Five years from prior certificate's expiration date	The Franklin's designation expired on June 1, 2020.  Their re-designation evaluation was approved on September 15, 2023, and expires on June 1, 2025.
<b>Early</b>	Designations renewed more than one year before the expiration date.  <b>Standard re-designation submittal fees apply.</b>	Five years from the re-designation approval date.	The Jones's designation expires on June 1, 2025.  Their re-designation evaluation was approved on September 15, 2023, and expires September 15, 2028.
<b>Expired</b>	New designations issued to homes with certificates that have been expired for more than five years.  <b>Standard new designation submittal fees apply.</b>	Five years from the approval date of the new designation.	The O'Neill's designation expired on June 1, 2018.  <b>They were not eligible for re-designation.</b>  However, their evaluator successfully submitted a new evaluation that was approved on September 15, 2023. That certificate expires September 15, 2028.
